Learn the APNK way

We are very pleased and excited to have begun work on a learning programme to offer our partner libraries for their staff. The programme will be customised to provide an individualised online training package with the aim of supporting library staff around the country to help meet customer needs and expectations in relation to use of computers, e-resources and the Internet. The programme has been named "LEARN@APNK".

A Project Control/Reference Group (PCRG) has been established comprising some partner library specialists and managers, learning and education specialists, and APNK staff. Our PCRG are spread around the country and we're lucky enough to be able to meet using a multi-party videoconferencing and presentation facility. We have our initial meeting under our belts with some members using APNK PCs and webcams!

The project has 4 phases:-

1. Investigation and Project Definition
2. Learning Framework Development
3. Learning Design
4. Learning Delivery

We are not re-inventing the wheel, as LEARN@APNK will be based on the "CCLearn" programme developed for Christchurch City Libraries, who have kindly gifted some resources to APNK. With this base componentry and the video-conferencing facility we hope to make swift progress and be in a position to start to offer the programme to libraries by end May 2010.
