In the interests of removing any barriers to those wishing to apply, and to make the most of the funds available, the Aotearoa People's Network Kaharoa will supply a full 'Kete package' to any partner library who makes a successful application. This will include -

- An A3 colour scanner (Fuji Xerox DocuScan C4250)
- Hosted Kete (online digital repository)
- Training for one staff member in Kete administration
- Loan of a digital audio recorder (either a Marantz PD620 or Fostex FR-2LE)

Governance Group

The APNK Governance Group met November 19th 2009 in Wellington. Agenda items up for discussion included -

- Ongoing sustainability and expansion of the APNK service - cost modelling will be done early in 2010 before any further decisions are made regarding this. The continuing financial support from NLNZ and the need to articulate clearly the values of the service to all involved were key messages.
- Mark Lawrence was congratulated for his work on delivering the GO-GO system, as were the APNK and the Partner Libraries for the 3M and the Extra Touch Awards.
- There was agreement to archive the Business Development Framework and produce new documents which will include vision statements, strategic directions, and a timeline recounting the development of the organisation so far.

GO-GO System

After a successful pilot with Puke Ariki in New Plymouth the GO-GO (Get On Get Off) PC control system is now available to libraries wishing to buy this added service, with charges for the system calculated on a cost recovery basis.

As well as Puke Ariki, the system was installed at Wanganui in December and Timaru is next on the list later this month. Stratford have also taken up the GO-GO option and will have the system installed early next month.

The rollout of the new regional pages (the home site displayed on People's Network machines) began in pilot form with Nelson District libraries in November. Since then the switch from the old "blue pages" to the new version has been made at all partner libraries and has gone very smoothly. The team here at APNK HQ would like to thank everyone for their co-operation and enthusiasm during this process.

Roughly half of partner libraries have now taken up the option of customising their own regional pages with banner images, home page blurbs and additional Go Local information and links. In order to help support those staff taking on this added responsibility a [Regional Site Admins group](#) has been started on the Community of Practice. The full list of regional pages also offers a look at what other libraries around the country have done.
