




### Nelson gets GO-GO

The city library will be taking a dual approach with its PCs in future with similar PC control systems in use for both their APNK PCs and council-operated, 'library member priority' machines.

The Aotearoa People's Network Kaharoa is a service of the National Library of New Zealand. On 1 February National Library and Archives New Zealand merged with the Department of Internal Affairs.

As a result APNK email addresses have changed, for instance [peoples.network@natlib.govt.nz](mailto:peoples.network@natlib.govt.nz) changes to [peoples.network@dia.govt.nz](mailto:peoples.network@dia.govt.nz). Old addresses will continue to work for 1 year but we recommend you update your contact details for us ASAP.

## New Zealand records on Ancestry.com

Many APNK libraries have a subscription to the ever popular [www.AncestryLibrary.com](http://www.AncestryLibrary.com) database, a site filled with digitised documents invaluable to genealogists.

As of last week, this resource includes 20 million New Zealand records, in particular New Zealand electoral rolls up to 1981, a real boon for Kiwi family historians.

At subscribing libraries this database can be accessed via APNK PCs or WiFi using the link supplied on the APNK regional portal, on the Get Info page. URLs or links from other websites may not provide access to this increasingly useful online resource.
